With four subscription programs, three exciting World premières, two of Australia's leading chamber choirs in collaboration, and one Adelaide première of a formidable new work drawn from the diary of Anne Frank, our 2016 season is living proof of music's power to move and inspire.

We warmly welcome ex-ACS soprano Greta Bradman, The Benaud Trio and Dean Newcomb to share James Whitbourn's intensely beautiful *Annelies*.

We have commissioned new music by two of Australia's emerging composers - Daniel Brinsmead (currently UK based) and David John Lang (Adelaide) who will feature in *Immortal Fire* and *Songs of Longing*. We are also very excited to première a new work by one of Australia's leading choral composers, Paul Stanhope.

Following our highly successful collaborations with the Sydney and Brisbane Chamber Choirs in recent years, ACS begins a new collaboration in 2016 with Melbourne's Polyphonic Voices. In the lofty cathedrals of Melbourne and Adelaide, our combined performances of Fauré's own chamber version of his timeless Requiem will be an event to remember.

Inspired by the poetry of W. H. The central pairing of Britten's *Hymn* and Stanhope's *Lament* view St. Cecilia – music's patron saint – from quite different angles. This is indeed music born of vision, love and devotion.

These surprising yet comforting words were penned by Annelies Marie Frank, a German teenager who, from 1942 - 1944, kept a diary while hiding from the Nazis in the dark confines of her family's 'secret annexe'.

James Whitbourn's extended cantata *Annelies* is the first major choral setting of Anne Frank's diary and has already been hailed as one of the most significant choral works of our time. Composed for solo soprano, chamber choir and piano trio with clarinet, *Annelies* explores the emotional journey undertaken by this extraordinary young girl from her first days in hiding until her family's eventual capture and internment in a concentration camp by the Nazis. A truly inspirational work of art.

BEN JONSON, THE HOUR-GLASS

Songs of Longing draws its inspiration from two song cycles of love and longing, meeting and parting - Longing Songs by Adrian Williams (texts by John Donne) and The Hourglass by American composer Irving Fine (a setting of six texts by Ben Jonson). Two works by Australians Callie Wood and David John Lang also pursue this passionate path. The program also explores the idea of transformation with the inclusion of two of the most-loved Renaissance vocal works, Byrd's Ave Verum Corpus and Purcell's Hear My Prayer, O Lord, both in their original form and in re-imagined versions by American Steven Stucky and Swede Sven-David Sandström.

FROM IN PARADISUM

Our experience tells us that sometimes the only thing better than the sound of one chamber choir singing gloriously beautiful music is the sound of two chamber choirs singing gloriously beautiful music! So, for this program we herald a new collaboration between ACS and Melbourne's Polyphonic Voices with Fauré's enduring and much-loved Requiem in his own chamber version for soprano and baritone soloists, choir, harp, horns, organ, solo violin and the rich velvety sounds of the lower strings. The program also features both Adelaide Chamber Singers and Polyphonic Voices performing their own selection of unaccompanied choral works, including the world première of a new work by Paul Stanhope.



Adelaide Chamber Singers has been a passionate and innovative contributor to music making in Adelaide for thirty years. Formed in 1985 by its Artistic Director and Conductor Carl Crossin, the ensemble comprises some of Adelaide's best and most experienced ensemble singers, some of whom are also emerging artists or conductors in their own right. ACS is widely respected as one of Australia's leading chamber choirs and was awarded one of SA's premier Arts awards, the 2011 Ruby Award for "sustained contribution by an organisation".

In 2013, Adelaide Chamber Singers performed to critical acclaim at three of Europe's leading competitive choral festivals: the Musica Sacra a Roma in Italy, the Llangollen International Musical Eisteddfod in Wales and the 1st European Choir Games in Austria. ACS subsequently won six out of six Gold awards, the Vincitore della Gran Premio (Grand Prize) in Rome , and the Pavarotti Trophy for "Choir of the World at Llangollen 2013" in Wales.

Other international appearances have included: the 2014 Polyfollia World Showcase and Marketplace for Choral Singing in France, the 2006 International Choral Kathaumixw in Canada (where ACS won the award of "Choir of the World at Kathaumixw 2006"), the 2006 International Choral Festival in the USA, the 2006 Cambridge Summer Music Festival in England, the 2004 Tokyo International Festival, the 6th World

Symposium on Choral Music in the USA in 2002, the Asia Pacific Symposium on Choral Music in Singapore in 2001, the 1999 Norfolk and Norwich Festival, and the 1996 National Convention of the Association of British Choral Directors.

Adelaide Chamber Singers has performed at the Adelaide, Melbourne and Perth International Festivals as well as at WOMADelaide in collaboration with Kronos Quartet. ACS has taken part in a range of regional festivals around Australia including: the Bundaleer, Coonawarra, Barossa and Coriole Festivals, the Port Fairy Spring Music Festival, the Brisbane Festival of Contemporary Sacred Music and the Musica Viva Huntington Estate Festival in NSW. ACS has also recently performed with Josh Groban and The Rolling Stones.
